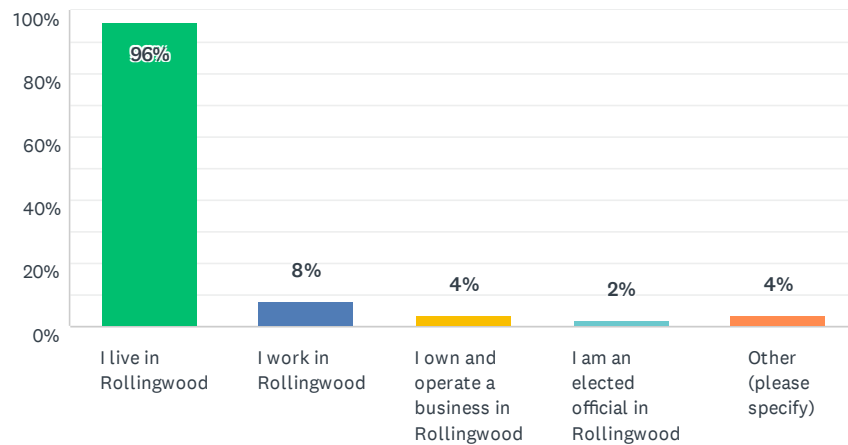

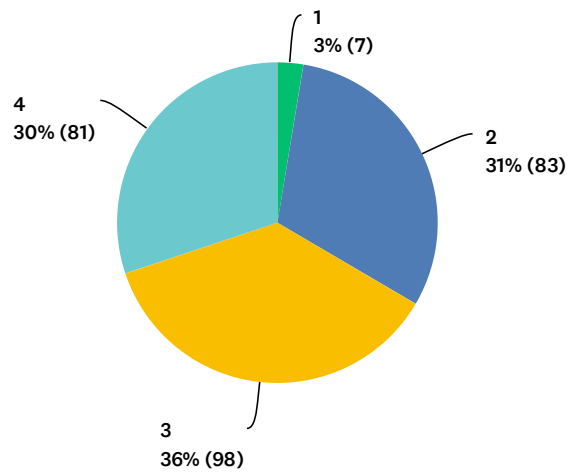

## Q2 Referring to the map above, which section of the City do you live or conduct business in?

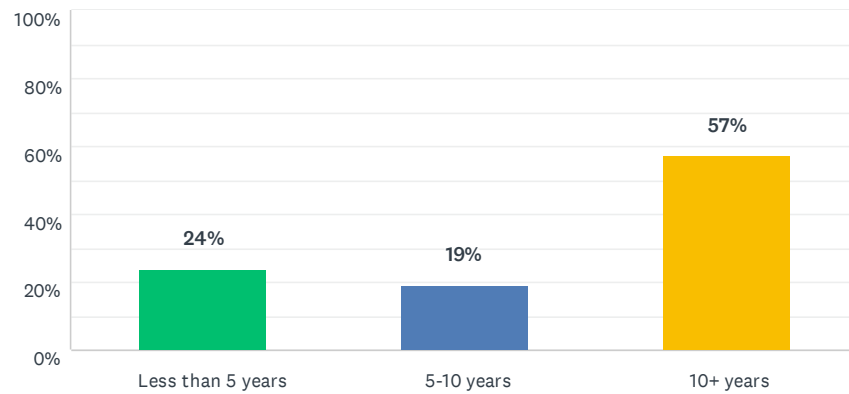

### Q3 How long have you lived or worked in Rollingwood?

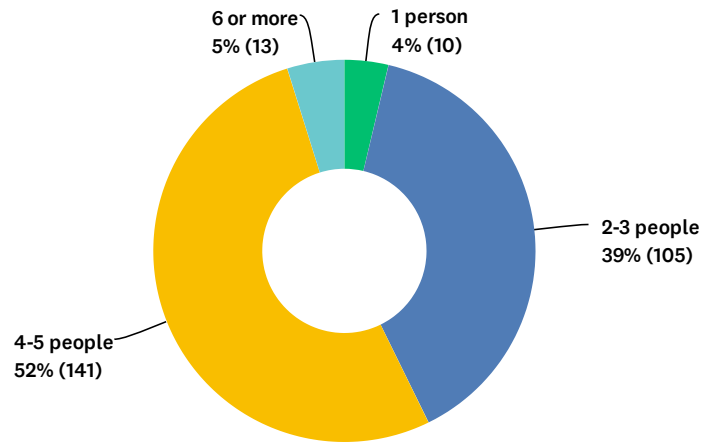

## Q4 How many people usually live in your home?

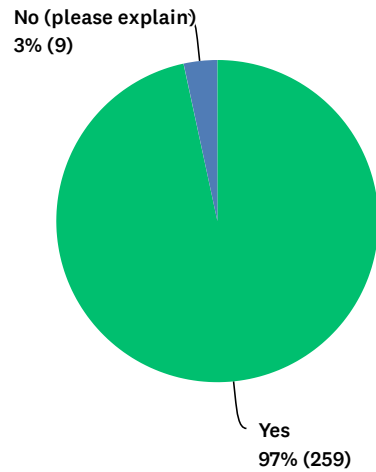

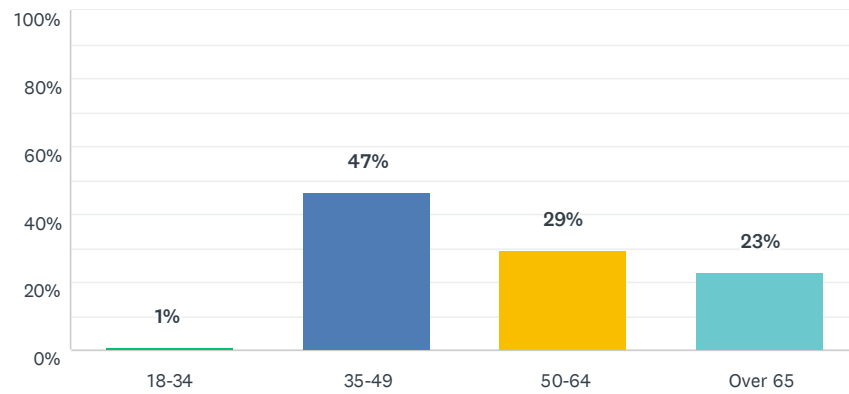

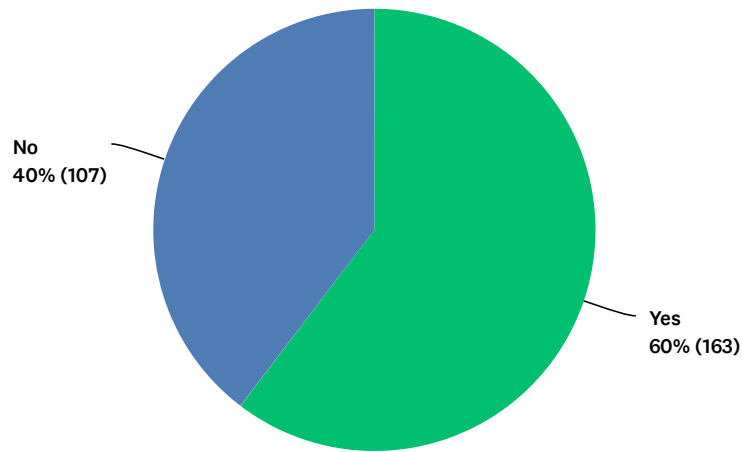

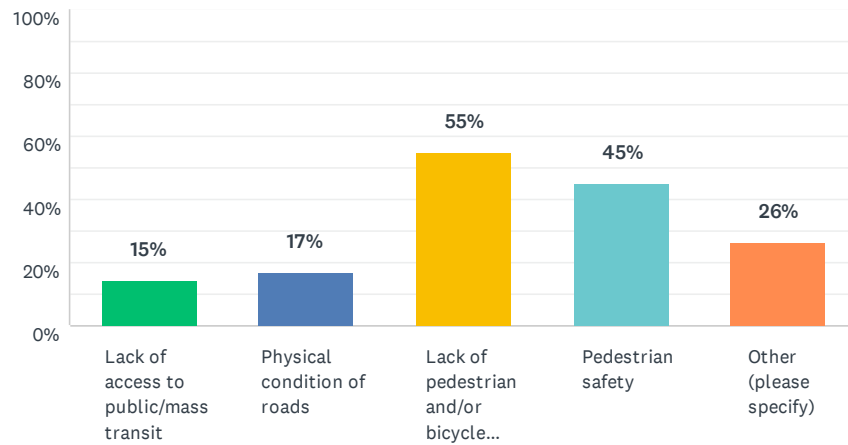
